- Consensus on aligning the work of the Mechanism and the Africa regional United Nations Sustainable Development Group teams with the Joint United Nations-African Union Framework for Enhanced Partnership in Peace and Security and African Union-United Nations Framework for the Implementation of Agenda 2063 and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
