Draft annotated agenda

1. Opening of the meeting

The opening session will be presided over by the Chair of the outgoing Bureau of the Committee of Experts, until a new Bureau is elected. Opening statements will be delivered by the Chair of the outgoing Bureau, the Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and a representative of the Government of Ethiopia.

2. Election of the Bureau and adoption of the agenda and programme of work

The composition of the new Bureau will be announced following consultations by the heads of delegation. The Bureau will comprise five members: one Chair, three Vice-Chairs and one rapporteur, to be elected on the basis of equitable geographical representation. The geographical distribution of officers elected at previous sessions is set out in the annex to the present document. The incoming Chair will preside over the rest of the proceedings following brief remarks. As proposed at the previous session, the Committee of Experts may decide to establish an ad hoc working group to work on the draft report and resolutions. The group will have 10 members drawn from the outgoing and incoming Bureaux. The working group will be chaired by the first Vice-Chair of the Bureau. The Committee will also be invited to consider and adopt the draft provisional agenda and programme of work, subject to such amendments as deemed necessary.

3. Overview of recent economic and social developments in Africa

Under this agenda item, the secretariat will present an overview of economic and social developments in Africa in 2017. The presentation will highlight

recent developments in the global economy and their implications for Africa. It will include an analysis of trends in subregional and regional economic performances, including trends in social development and the continent's growth prospects, links between structural change and social development, and risks and uncertainties associated with the medium-term growth performance of Africa. It will also examine the underlying policy initiatives and options for dealing with emerging issues and longer-term challenges. This will be followed by a general discussion on the main policy issues and recommendations highlighted in the presentation.

4. Assessment of progress on regional integration in Africa

Under this agenda item, the secretariat will present a progress report on the status of regional integration in Africa, including highlights of key challenges and constraints. The presentation will be followed by a general discussion on key issues noted by the secretariat, with a view to refining policies and strategies for accelerating the integration process.

5. Presentation on the theme of the fifty-first session of the Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development: "African Continental Free Trade Area: creating fiscal space for jobs and economic diversification"

The secretariat will give a brief presentation to introduce the theme of the fiftyfirst session, drawing on the relevant issues paper. The paper sets out the economic and developmental arguments for the African Continental Free Trade Area and the importance of its ratification and implementation. It further provides an analysis of the Free Trade Area as a pathway to fiscal sustainability and contains a discussion of possible supporting measures that may be used to enhance the fiscal space for job creation and economic diversification. The presentation will be followed by a general discussion.

6. Statutory issues

Under this agenda item, the secretariat will give presentations on various statutory issues relating to its work and its subsidiary organs. The Committee of Experts may wish to consider and offer recommendations to the Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development for further guidance and action, as appropriate. (a) Report of the Executive Secretary on the activities of the Economic Commission for Africa (covering the period April 2017 to March 2018)

The Deputy Executive Secretary of ECA will make brief closing remarks. The Chair of the Bureau of the Committee of Experts will summarize the main outcomes of the deliberations and declare the meeting closed.
