Background

□Africa has impressive growth record but development challenges remain

- Growth rates averaged 4.1 % in 2013 almost double the global average;
- Africa's growth is non-inclusive because of its limited contribution to job creation, overall improvement to people's living standards, and reduction of inequality (ECA, 2011);
- Africa has the lowest levels of human and social development (health, education, gender empowerment and extreme poverty);
- Africa remains home to the world's highest proportion of poor people and is off track to meeting some key MDGs;
- Sectoral problems e.g., poor infrastructure and low human capital, compounding the challenges.

Background/...

☐ The inclusive green economy in the development agenda for Africa

- ❖ IGE is an alternative approach for tackling Africa's unique challenges including structural fragility, persistently high poverty and unemployment, environmental degradation, vulnerability to climate change and rapid population growth;
- An IGE could generate wealth and promote pro-poor growth through building up natural capital on which the livelihood of the poor depends (UNEP, 2011).

Background/...

- ☐ African countries have limited resources for IGE policies
- National assessments to identify green growth challenges and opportunities;
- Technical & financial capacity to undertake the transition at significant scale;
- Capacity to formulate policies and strategies and to develop IGE projects with costs/benefits information;
- Capacity to identify and quantify investments needed for IGE;
- Resources to link IGE to economic diversification, industrialization, innovation and technological development;
- Resources for an evidence-based institutional and policy shift;
- Mobilizing domestic resources to close financing gaps.

□Integrated assessment tools and methodologies for IGE policy formulation and implementation

- IGE/IGG embedded in national development plans or a standalone strategy; with increasing number countries;
- ❖ IGE/IGG rrecognizes and builds on clear and strong linkages within the economic-social-environmental dimensions of sustainable development
- ❖ IGE/IGG ultimate goal is to align the economy with the principles of sustainable development
- ❖ IGE/IGG requires an integrated analysis

□Integrated assessment tools and methodologies /...

- Integrated assessment is the science that deals with an integrated systems approach for dealing with complex societal problems, e.g., sustainable development, embedded in a process-based context
- ❖ In relation with IGE, It aims to analyse the multiple causes and impacts of sustainable development in order to develop policy options for a strategic solution of the problem in question
- Integrated assessment can support IGE policy formulation and implementation with analytical tools and methods, such as models, scenarios, uncertainty and risk analyses; and participatory approaches, such as focus groups, policy exercises and dialogue
