
# **ClimDev Africa**

A programme mandated by the African Heads of States and government implemented by a consortium of three African Institutions:

- African Union Commission (AUC)
- UN Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA)
- African Development Bank (AfDB)



#### **Origins and Context ClimDev-Africa**



...through enhancing African countries' capacities to better manage climate change risks/opportunities



## **ClimDev-Africa Vision**

Sustainable attainment of poverty reduction and other MDGs in Africa through policies and decisions on practices in Africa that take full account of climate change risks and opportunities at all levels (regional, sub-regional, national, local, community and individual)

Enhance the scientific basis/operational infrastructures

Strengthen partnerships between government institutions, private sector, civil society & vulnerable communities ClimDev-Africa vision operationalized through implementing activities that...

> Improve frameworks for decision-making, awareness & advocacy




# **Relevance of ClimDev-Africa**

- Unique in that it brings climate information & development together
- Conceptually relevant
- Reinforces Africa's development agenda
- Political buy-in at the highest level
- Combination of partners' strengths
  - ECA to generate knowledge and analytical inputs to inform policy;
  - AfDB to demonstrate return on investments in climate information in order to optimize new investments in CIS;
  - AUC to enable policy formulation and uptake at the highest level

# **Key Achievements**

- Provide the policy space for dialogue, ideas & knowledge sharing
  - CCDA, COP, UN Climate Summit
  - Feeding back into ClimDev-Africa strategic orientation
- Influencing policy
  - AGN, Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss & Damage, CAHOSCC\*, AMCEN, AMCOMET\*\*
- Emergence of Climate Research for Development (CR4D) Programme
- Incremental growth in countries that have the capacity to provide quality climate services to a variety of sectors
- Momentum is gathering in terms of strengthened early warning & DRR, through the support to RCCs
- Creation of demand for CIS
  - 93 project submissions, 56 selected as bankable from first call of CDSF
- Capacity enhancement for African youths & Young lawyers



# Strategic Direction: 2016-2020





- Climate sensitive sectors drive growth
- Adverse climate change impacts
- Increased investment in climate smart decisions (policies, technology choices, financial flows)
- Supply of climate information services (CIS) & capacity to use CIS needs to be enhanced

- Number of initiatives aimed at providing climate information services are emerging across Africa
- Need to harness the comparative advantage of each of these initiatives to scale up investment in CISdevelopment planning linkages






- Political mandate to invest in and promote use of CIS in decision making



Sustainability is driven through appropriate strategies such as:


- Ensuring that its projects are bankable,

Phase II will partner with a range of implementing, policy analysis, and resource funding partners to harness the comparative advantage of actors operating in the African decision making landscape


