



# Knowledge Management and Influence Core Group Meeting

# Report

19-20 Oct 2017 Amber Hotel Nairobi, Kenya



### Introduction

From the 19-20 October 2017, WISER core group of partners gathered at Amber Hotel in Nairobi to articulate a robust knowledge management and influence strategy to support WISER phase II. The event was a culmination of a process to formulate a knowledge support framework to strengthen the impact and reach of the WISER programme.

On opening the workshop, Mr. Frank Rutabingwa from ECA noted that weather is important, but planning has not been done well. Climate change has been a stressor but need not be, it can be an opportunity. Climate change work and interventions are needed to bequeath our children a better world. Knowledge management and communications are necessary because deniers are reneging on climate commitments and responsibilities. The is need to be innovative, to correct the misguided views being voiced elsewhere.

On behalf of the East Africa component, Mr. John Mungai welcomed participants to Nairobi. He outlined the quick starts project activities of the component i.e. SCIPEA, AMDA (KMD/KQ), and HIGHWAY, and noted that the latter 2 are implemented by WMO. He underscored the role and implemented support that knowledge management plays for influencing change in behavior.

The objectives and expected results of the event are outlined below.

### Objectives

- Contextualization of WISER knowledge management and its progress metrics
- Review and update the WISER Policy and Enabling Environment component (PEEC) and East Africa component influence matrices
- Review and update the joint WISER knowledge management strategy

#### Expected outcome

- Final drafts of the WISER influence matrices for both East Africa and PEEC
- Update draft WISER knowledge management strategy, ready for validation by WISER stakeholders
- Shared understanding of collaboration with ACMAD and GFCS on developing a CIS decision making tool

#### **Participants**

In addition to the two WISER implementing partners, participants at the event included representatives from the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), Kenya

Meteorological Department (KMD), the IGAD Climate Prediction and Application Center (ICPAC), the Pan Africa Media Alliance on Climate Change (PAMACC), the Africa Ministerial Conference on Meteorology (AMCOMET) and knowledge management practitioners.


#### **Discussions and presentations**

ACPC knowledge management strategy: A consultant engaged to support development of a knowledge management strategy for ACPC presented the results of his assessment of the centers knowledge management readiness. The presentation covered findings on ACPC's knowledge management maturity level, stakeholders /key audiences, a SWOT analysis, ACPC/WISER knowledge management strategic vision, mission and objectives, tools and methods, need for implementation plan, roles and responsibilities, monitoring, evaluation and learning, partnerships, resource requirements, and sustainability.

**KM Strategy schematics and influence matrices**: Mr. Charles Muraya from the PEEC presented the schematics providing a high-level perspective of the joint WISER KM strategy, as developed over several in person and remote meetings between the two WISER components. The first schematic depicts the following three levels of KM through which KM and ultimately influence will be undertaken:

- Sharing developments and knowledge within the WISER programme
- Communicating WISER knowledge beyond the programme
- Influencing policy and practice

Participants were concerned that the themes organized in a circle do not reflect well on their perceived sequencing, thus re-organized the schematic to the one below:



Both stakeholder matrices developed for each of the three knowledge management interventions levels, and organized by enabler category, were also discussed and updated.

**WISER knowledge management and influence strategy:** Participants were stepped through the draft strategy document by John Mungai from the East African component, and provided feedback throughout the draft document. The strategy was simultaneously updated as discussions, contributions and feedback ensued. During the deliberations, two participants (Josephine Wilson, WMO/AMCOMET and Hayley Jones, UKMO / EAC) contributed remotely via telephone.

### Conclusion

After two days of intense and insightful introspection and assessment of the draft WISER knowledge management and influence strategy, the experts concurred on

improved drafts of the WISER influence matrices for both East Africa and PEEC; updated draft of the WISER knowledge management strategy, ready for validation by WISER stakeholders; and a shared understanding of the collaboration with ACMAD and GFCS on developing a CIS decision making tool.

Media partners from PAMACC invited to shed light on mechanisms to enhance the collaboration with WISER on the diffusion and democratization of CIS in Africa provided an expose of their pan-Africa media network and their climate news portal (www.pamacc.org). They voiced readiness to partner with WISER to disseminate knowledge products and key messages.
