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**Key recommendations of sessions of the Regional
Coordination Mechanism for Africa (2006–2015)****Background**

1. The Regional Coordination Mechanism for Africa (RCM-Africa) holds its annual meetings in Addis Ababa, with the United Nations Deputy Secretary-General and the Deputy Chairperson of the African Union Commission (AUC) as its chairs. The last such annual meeting was held in Abuja from 28 to 30 March 2014 and it marked the fifteenth successive occasion on which United Nations agencies and organizations had held consultations with key African institutions on strengthening coherence and ensuring a more coordinated delivery of United Nations support for development in Africa.

2. The overall purpose of the annual meetings is to promote synergy and coordination among the agencies and organizations of the United Nations system, with a view to improving their collective response to meeting the priority needs of the Africa region and in their delivery of support to African Union organizations, for greater effectiveness and impact. It aims to achieve this by stepping up the joint programming and implementation of activities, operationalized through a cluster system. Another key objective of RCM-Africa is to improve cooperation and collaboration between United Nations agencies and African continental organizations such as AUC, the New Economic Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD) Agency, the regional economic communities and the African Development Bank.

3. Even though 14 annual meetings of RCM-Africa have been held since 1999, it was only after the seventh such meeting that the mechanism gained important momentum in strengthening partnerships between organizations of the United Nations system and African regional and subregional organizations. A number of recommendations to that end were put forward by RCM-Africa during the consecutive annual meetings between 2006 and 2012. The RCM-Africa secretariat, which was set in place to coordinate United Nations support to the African Union and its NEPAD programme and which, pursuant to the recommendation of RCM-Africa at its tenth session, in November 2009, is jointly operationalized by the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and AUC, has been particularly diligent in ensuring follow-up to the implementation of RCM-Africa recommendations.

4. The RCM-Africa secretariat has prepared the present compilation, recording the recommendations and priorities identified at the successive sessions, from the seventh to the fifteenth, inclusive, of RCM-Africa and indicating the extent to which the recommendations have been implemented, with the purpose of assisting clusters and subclusters with the implementation of the recommendations and priorities.
