SOME CHARACTERISTICS OF BURKINA FASO NDCS

Burkina Faso's national contributions behave 2 components:

- Mitigation Component, which aim to reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- Adaptation Component, which aim to reduce the vulnerability of natural and human systems to the effects of actual or projected climate change

REFERENCE YEAR: 2007, date of completion of the second inventory of greenhouse gases in Burkina Faso.

TARGET YEAR: 2030

planned implementation deviceImplementing bodies

- A Coordination Unit is placed under the supervision of the SP-CNDD, in charge of coordinating and supervising (monitoring) the implementation of the different projects. This Coordination Unit will consist of three technical entities:
 - A coordinating entity responsible for programming the implementation activities of the various projects;
 - An Adaptation Technical Unit that will coordinate the implementation and follow-up of projects Adaptation component
 - A Mitigation Technical Unit will take care of coordinating the implementation and monitoring of Mitigation projects.
