CHALLENGES



Resource:

- Paucity of data on robust research, good practices and lessons learnt on green economy;
- Donors work on a limiting funding window;
- Lack of continuous substantive financial support from development partners.


Implementation:

- Strategies for adaptive management;
- Absence of strong and robust evaluative culture and metric system.

Knowledge:

- Limited understanding about the opportunities associated with green economy;
- Increased demand from member states with limited resources to satisfy such requests;
- Benefits of Climate Information Services not fully appreciated.

LESSONS LEARNED



- Phased approach in green economy;
- New partnerships and adequate expertise involvement;
- Senior Experts Dialogues are critical for the success of programmes:
 - Dialogue platform;
- Better interdisciplinary linkages:
 - A triple Win (policies, co-ordination and capacity development);
- High involvement of member States;
- National institutions lead policy studies.


