## **Programme**

This workshop is hosted for Members of Parliament as a partnership between the Parliament of Sierra Leone and the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA). It intends to establish relationship between UNECA and the Sierra Leone Parliament in order to foster collaboration between the two institutions. The Workshop is design to build the capacity of Members of Parliament in the use of Climate Information for planning and decision making.

This workshop focuses on engaging with MPs on the overview on Climate Services in Africa, with particular reference to SDGs, especially SDG 11 and 13 and the Paris Agreement.
