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INTRODUCTION - RESPONSIBILITY

The AfDB Statistics Department is responsible for the Bank's statistical activities that focus on two main components:-

- Providing support for effective development of statistical capacity and systems in African countries Statistical Capacity Building
- Mainstreaming results measurement in Bank operations to ensure their operational effectiveness as well as meeting the data needs for the Bank's Projects in the Region

The Funding Model



1. Statistical Capacity Building Program managed by Statistics Department (over \$150m/15 years)

- Technical Assistance (TA) & Related statistical activities to RMCs
- Support to SROs, STCs
- Training Workshops for country officials
- Regional Data Validation Workshops
- Advocacy/strategic events (ASSD, StatCom etc)

2. Transitional States Facility

- Support to 21 Transitional States (21 LICs)
- Ordinary Lending/Grant Operations
 - Statistical components in AfDB projects/programs in African countries (country driven)
 - Stand alone statistical projects

Power and Light up Africa - Africa Infrastructure Knowledge Programme

- Support to infrastructure statistics and infrastructure knowledge products. The objective of this initiative is to achieve a major improvement in the country-level knowledge base of the infrastructure sector. Areas covered include:
 - Transport
 - Electricity
 - ICT
 - Water and Sanitation
- Helping countries to integrate infrastructure statistics in their NSS the Africa Infrastructure Knowledge Programme
- Validation and editing of this data led to the computation of the 2020 Africa Infrastructure Development Index (AIDI) at global and sector levels - AIDI data used to validate Performance Based Allocations for ADF countries in collaboration with FIRM
- Investment needs models for Power, Water and ICT sectors were shared with internal stakeholders

Feed Africa (Agriculture Statistics)

- Development of Strategic Plans for Agricultural and Rural Statistics (SPARS). 24 countries covered.
- Construction of Master sampling frames 6 countries have received support: Rwanda, Burundi, Benin, Kenya, Niger, and Senegal
- Compilation of Food Balance Sheets (FBS)- 8 countries have been or are being supported: Cote d'Ivoire, Kenya, Tanzania,
 Togo, Burkina Faso, Uganda, Mali, Namibia
- Use of Computer-Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) technology for agricultural data collection II countries have received or are receiving technical assistance in this area: Senegal, Burkina Faso, Liberia, Botswana, Benin, Cabo Verde, Namibia, Niger, Ghana, Malawi, and Tunisia
- Producing Agricultural Cost of Production (AgCoP) statistics for five countries: Cabo Verde, Tunisia, Lesotho, Malawi, and Madagascar
- Updated Agricultural Minimum Sets of Core Data (MSCD). ECST has supported 52 RMCs to regularly generate the minimum sets of core agricultural data for use in agricultural policy
- Reporting on Agricultural Statistics Capacity Indicators (ASCI) for 52 RMCs

Integrate Africa

- International Comparison Program for Africa (ICP-Africa)- The Bank coordinates ICP-Africa activities RMC in the region.
 - 176 countries participating globally in the last round with a benchmark of 2017
 - 50 participating countries in Africa
 - Helps to compare economies
 - Gives an indication of price differences between countries
 - Global results for ICP released in May 2020
 - Africa highlights report released in June 2020



SCB THROUGH HIGH5 LENS...

Integrate - Industrialize Africa

- National Accounts (NA)- Support to RMCs to rebase GDP & improve National Accounts
 - Countries supported recently: Malawi, Cote d'Ivoire, Botswana, Zambia, Uganda, Eswatini, etc
- Statistical Business Register (SBR) for designing sampling frames for all economic surveys
 - currently supporting Botswana, Malawi, etc.
 - SBR assessment is currently being done to identify areas of support.
- Harmonized Consumer Price Index (HCPI)- The Bank provides Technical and Financial support to COMESA & SADC RMCs for the monthly production and dissemination of the HCPI, to inform the regional macroeconomic convergence agenda.
 - Support given to Somalia has allowed it to disseminate CPI monthly for more that 2 years.





Improve the Quality of Lives of Africans

- Technical Assistance to 2020 Round of Population & Housing Censuses
 - In 2019 provided ICT technical support to Kenya in its first ever paperless Population and Housing Census
- SDGs Data & Monitoring: Assisted RMCs to improve the quality of their data for monitoring progress toward the SDGs. The Bank has developed and installed SDG Data Hubs in all the RMCs.
- Civil Registration and Vital Statistics. The Bank provides methodological support to improve the collection of Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) in RMCs.
- Household Surveys and Poverty Work: The Bank provides technical & financial support to RMCs for household survey fieldwork leading to the generation of country poverty statistics.
- Labour Statistics support in collaboration with ILO TA on labor force surveys and household expenditure surveys, support to undertake labor statistics classifications, etc. Guidelines for labor force surveys with African specificities recently produced.



CROSS CUTTING - RSDS AND NSDS

- National Strategies for Development of Statistics (NSDSs)
 - Technical Assistance in the Development and evaluation of NSDSs as a means of coordinating statistical coordination in RMCs. 7 RMCs have received support on NSDS development Senegal, Rwanda, Togo, Zambia, Namibia, Zanzibar and Egypt. Work has begun in Congo Braz., Burundi and Gabon.
- Regional Strategies for Development of Statistics (RSDSs)
 - Technical assistance has been provided in evaluation of RSDSs for COMESA and SADC



CROSS CUTTING - DATA MANAGEMENT AND DISSEMINATION

Data dissemination and storage - Africa Information Highway (AIH)

- AIH: serves as a central repository and hub for easy access to real-time development data on African countries, with live data links connecting all 54 RMCs and 16 regional & sub-regional organizations to facilitate data collection, management, and dissemination
- AfDB Open Data Portal equipped with a data submission tool
- Objective to increase access to official and other data
 - currently disseminating COVID19 data for all RMCs through the Dashboard
- 30 countries regularly update the National Summary Data Page on AIH
- In May 2015, the IMF Board approved a resolution under which the Fund would use the AIH as their main data reporting and dissemination system in Africa.
- Since 2017, the Bank has been a member the UN Global Working Group on Big Data for official statistics.
 - Group explores the benefits and challenges of the use of Big Data for official statistics and for the compilation of SDG indicators.





- SCB-5 will commence in 2021
- DGs should spearhead advocacy for statistics in Bank projects in RMCs to complement SCB programmes
- Need for early specification of CB by DGs to streamline support
- Be champions of robust M&E systems at country level to create demand for statistics in RMCs
- Need to align NSDSs with NDPs to create relevance of statistics in RMCs
- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Bank plans to better harness technology to increase the efficiency of its work. The Statistics Department therefore will go digital, using its Africa Information Highway (AIH).

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
