



Adeyinka Adeyemi is a Senior Adviser at the UNECA where he heads the Regional Integration and Infrastructure Cluster and Focal Point for NEPAD. He leads the project to harmonize policies, laws and regulations on infrastructure investment in Africa as well as the domestication of a model law on infrastructure investment in Africa. He was educated at the Universities of Ibadan and Lagos as well as Harvard University, where he was a Fellow (Press, Politics and Public Policy).
