Information Note for Participant

Thank you for confirming your participation in the upcoming Fifth Joint Annual Meetings of the African Union Conference of Ministers of Economy and Finance and ECA Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development scheduled to take place in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia from 22 to 27 March 2012. The venue of the meeting will be the African Union's New **Conference Complex** at the African Union Commission (AUC) Headquarters in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

It is important to take note of the following information which will assist you in the planning and logistics of your travel to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

Following an agreement reached between the Ethiopian Government, the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and the African Union Commission (AUC), all participants attending meetings, seminars or workshops organized or co-organized in Addis Ababa by ECA and the AUC can obtain business visas on arrival at Bole International Airport. The Ethiopian Immigration Authority requires that a list with the names of all participants should be presented prior to their arrival, and that participants should carry with them and present to the Immigration an **official letter of invitation** for this event.

In order to assist participants in obtaining visas upon arrival, we will need to receive the following particulars **five working days** in advance, i.e by 16 March 2012.

- 1. First name and second name
- 2. Nationality
- 3. Flight details (arrival and departure)

Please note that an Ethiopian visa costs \$ 20.00 or € 17.00 per person and that payment must be made either in US dollars or in euros at the time of issue. Holders of diplomatic and service passports or of United Nations laissez-passer will receive visas free of charge. Bank receipts for money converted at the airport or elsewhere must be safely kept, as they may be asked for on departure.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Visitors to Ethiopia should be in possession of a valid health certificate for yellow fever. Vaccination against cholera is also required for any person who has visited or transited through a cholera-infected area within six days prior to arrival in Ethiopia. As Addis Ababa is situated at an altitude of 2,400 metres above sea level, it is advisable to take precautionary measures to avoid possible health problems that might occur as a result of the high altitude.

The African Union Commission's Medical Centre, situated within the AUC headquarters, will provide emergency medical services to participants and delegates attending meetings during this Conference.

Participants taking special medication should bring enough quantities of their medicines to last for the period they are staying, as some of them may not be found at the Medical Centre or in town. For acute health problems, the AUC Medical Centre is available to attend to individual concerns, against payment.

GUIDELINES ON PARTICIPANTS' PERSONAL SECURITY AND SAFETY

The Security and Safety Services of both AUC and the ECA always stand ready to serve all their clients. The cooperation of all participants is needed to ensure the safety of your valuables and your personal security.

Please adhere to the following precautionary measures while you are in the AUC premises:

- Display your Conference badge at the request of an authorized person and wear it visibly;
- Do not leave bags and parcels unattended, as they will be confiscated or destroyed;
- Do not bring unauthorized persons or children into the AUC Conference Centre;
- Safeguard your valuable property;
- Check for your documents and items before you leave the conference halls and meeting rooms;

HOTEL ACCOMMODATION

Most hotels will be expecting a final list from ECA by 15 March 2012, after which ECA will be subject to a cancellation penalty for rooms reserved and not

RECEPTION ON ARRIVAL

All participants will be met on arrival at Bole International Airport and will be assisted with immigration and customs formalities. The date and time of arrival of each participant in Addis Ababa with flight details should be sent to the focal points indicated above. Any subsequent changes should also be similarly communicated.

TEMPORARY IMPORT OF LAPTOPS AND OTHER CONFERENCE EQUIPMENT

To comply with the import regulations of the Government of Ethiopia, Conference participants should declare any laptops and conference equipment they carry with them when entering the country. In order to be able to assist with the temporary import of such items, ECA should receive, by 15 March 2012 at the latest, a detailed list of the items to be brought in, together with the arrival and departure details of the participant. Such items will be registered for temporary import by the customs office, and must be taken out of the country after the Conference.

Journalists coming with professional cameras will need to bring two passport-size photos and pay a fee of ETB 1,000.00 on arrival.

REGISTRATION AND IDENTIFICATION BADGES

Participants will be required to register and obtain identification badges prior to the opening of the meeting. The venue of registration will be Briefing Room 5 at the African Union Conference Centre (AUCC). Registration will start from 20 March 2012.

For identification and security reasons, identification badges should be worn by all participants at all times during the Conference and at official social functions.

TRANSPORT

You will arrive at Bole International Airport, which is located just five kilometres away from Addis Ababa city centre. Staff from ECA and AUC/ECA Protocol Officers will meet you at the airport.

Shuttle buses will be available to ferry participants back and forth from hotels to the Conference venue in the morning and at the end of the daily sessions. Regrettably, transport will not be provided during lunch breaks. All lunch breaks will take place within the African Union Conference premises.

If you require transport in Addis Ababa outside of Conference time, or to take you to the airport at the end of the Conference, you can book a taxi from the National Tourism Organization (NTO) by calling +251-(0)11-5-51 18 22 or +251-115-51 84 00, or take one of the yellow taxis parked outside your hotel.

MOBILE PHONES

Participants are encouraged to bring their dual-band mobile handsets to Addis Ababa (900/1800 MH). The Ethiopian Telecommunication Company offers SIM cards with pre-charged air time. The sim card costs \$3. Air time can be purchased for as little as \$0.60. Mobile phones are immediately activated by the Ethiopian Telecommunication Corporation when the SIM card is inserted into the phone.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT ETHIOPIA

Ethiopia is as large as France and Spain combined and has an area of 1,112,000 square metres. Addis Ababa is situated at an altitude of 2,400 metres. Agriculture is the backbone of the national economy; the principal exports from this sector include coffee, oil seeds, pulses, flowers, vegetables, sugar and animal feed. About 90 per cent of the population earns its living from the land. There is also a thriving livestock sector, and exports include cattle, hides and skins.

The population of Ethiopia is estimated at 77 million, and over 50 per cent of the population is under 20 years of age. The average number of inhabitants per square kilometre is 69. Ethiopia is a multi-ethnic State with a great variety of spoken languages. There are 83 languages with 200 dialects. The three main languages are Amharic, Tigrigna and Oromigna. English, French, Italian and Arabic are also spoken, mainly in Addis Ababa. CLIMATE

Ethiopia has two main seasons: the dry season which runs from October through May, and the rainy season which starts in late June and ends in September. Temperatures depend on season and altitude. Visitors are advised to bring warm clothes to respond to the changing weather.

ELECTRIC SUPPLY

Electric supply in Ethiopia is 220-240 volts, 50 cycles AC accessible via a 13-amp, two-pin socket.

CURRENCY

Ethiopian currency is denominated in "birr" and "centimes". The exchange rate fluctuates. The United Nations official exchange rate was **USD 1.00 = ETB 17.27** in February 2012.

There is a branch of the Commercial Bank of Ethiopia in the African Union Conference Centre. The Bank is open from Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. There are also an authorized currency exchange centres at the Sheraton, Hilton and Intercontinental hotels, as well as ATM machines for Visa/MasterCard users in the AU Conference Centre, as well as in major hotels, which will provide cash in birr. In addition, the AU Conference Centre has an ATM machine which will convert US dollars and euros into cash birr.
