Side event of the 8th Joint Annual Meetings of the ECA/AUC Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development on the theme:

MEASURING HUMAN EXCLUSION FOR STRUCTURAL TRANSFORMATION: THE AFRICAN SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT INDEX (ASDI)

In line with the main theme of the 8thJoint Annual Meetings of the ECA Conference of Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development and AUC Conference of Ministers of Economy and Financeon "Implementing Agenda 2063: Planning, Mobilizing and Financing for Development", the Social Development Policy Division (SDPD) of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) is organizing a side event on the theme: "*Measuring Human Exclusion for Structural Transformation: The African Social Development Index (ASDI)*".

The event will involve a roundtable discussion with a panel composed of:

- One Minister of finance and one Minister in charge of social sectors from African countries
- 1 senior official from the AUC and/or RECs involved in the formulation of the AU Agenda 2063
- The Deputy Executive Secretary of the Economic Commission for Africa
- 1 representative of private sector
- 1 representative of civil society or academic institution

The roundtable will bring together African policy makers, experts and representatives from UN agencies and intergovernmental bodies, development partners, private sector, civil society organizations and research institutions from around the continent.
