Central Africa has a huge potential of renewable natural resources. However, the economies of the sub-region are heavily dependent on exploitation of natural resources (oil, forests, mines, etc.) and consequently vulnerable to the exhaustible nature of raw materials and the volatility of their global-market prices. In spite of its potential, Central Africa is still far from a performance level that can permit it move resolutely towards achieving MDGs.
